Extracts from the Parish Council meeting on 21st July 2021. Your attention is drawn to the following:

### Traffic and highways

A parishioner reported ongoing problems with blocked drains on Frogge Street. Highways stated that a crew reported a fault in the system in February 2021 and an order to get the fault investigated and repaired was placed. However, the order was still outstanding and so the contractor was asked by Highways to expedite the order. Further investigation has identified that a new drain is likely to be needed. The poor state of footpaths along Frogge Street was also reported.

### Uttlesford District Council call for sites

The basic details for the 299 sites received during the call for sites have now been published and are available on the Uttlesford District Council (UDC) Local Plan Website - [https://www.uttlesford.gov.uk/lp-sites?utm\\_medium=email&utm\\_source=govdelivery](https://www.uttlesford.gov.uk/lp-sites?utm_medium=email&utm_source=govdelivery). These include potential large scale new communities as well as small scale developments in villages. UDC will consider these sites, alongside any that the Council chooses to identify, when developing the Local Plan. No decision has been taken at this stage on which sites to include in the Local Plan, and they are being published for information only at this stage.

### Openreach fibre broadband funded by the Government's Rural Gigabit Voucher

The Openreach fibre broadband funded by the Government's Rural Gigabit Voucher Scheme had not made any progress until this week, in which preliminary costings have now been provided. A further update will be provided in due course.

### Covid grant to support the vulnerable and those who need to self-isolate

Ickleton Parish Council has received a grant of £200.00 from South Cambridgeshire District Council (SCDC). This grant is intended to be used for things such as:

- Hand sanitiser and basic protective equipment
- Printing of leaflets to help keep people informed about your community group and its activities
- Paying for a few days of shopping or topping up an electricity meter for people who need to suddenly self-isolate and are demonstrably in financial hardship.

## Community Warden Scheme

A Community Warden Scheme for Ickleton and surrounding villages is in operation funded by South Cambs District Council. The warden for Ickleton is **Anita Gilchrist**.

Parishioners aged 60 or over who would like help to continue to live independently in their own home can get assistance from the Community Warden by providing a daily phone call (Mon - Fri) and support such as making drinks and a light meal, collecting prescriptions, small items of shopping, help with paperwork and making appointments, and signposting to other services where appropriate. There is a free 2 week trial and then a small weekly fee afterwards.

## **ICKLETON SOCIETY**

### **Archaeological Dig and Trench Talk**

The Cambridge Archaeology Field Group (CAFG) resumed their dig at Abbey Farm from 19 to 25<sup>th</sup> July.

What a dedicated group they are! This was the hottest week of the summer so far and, taking frequent breaks, they carried on digging each day. On the last Saturday a group of us gathered round the trench and display of finds, while Mike Coles and his colleagues, Jayne and Terry, showed us how they interpreted what we could see in the trench, explaining what they had learned so far and the finds. We're grateful to them for giving us their time and answering so many questions.

They had continued to work their way down through the layers in the trench, a few inches at a time as different surfaces emerged at different depths and in different parts of the trench. The finds are now all medieval including a few animal bones and pieces of pottery, some fairly high status. The pottery appears to have been discarded rather than being found where it was used. Maybe broken pieces from the Priory – we can't know. What we can see is that there has been a lot of activity in this area of a secular nature rather than it being part of the Priory itself. There is a very large post hole of later date (evidenced by a piece of a clay pipe found within the hole). The group had hoped to find a wall or ditch marking the boundary of the Priory and its farm but that hasn't emerged yet.

The site remains very intriguing and, after a well-earned rest, the group will be returning to continue digging from 23 August. We look forward to learning more about it then.

## Message from Rev Lydia

### ***Bread of heaven***

Often by August harvesting has been underway for some time. But the celebration of Lammas – at the beginning of August – was traditionally timed to coincide with gathering in the first crops of the season.

The name comes from the Old English – *hláfmæsse* – bread (*hláf*) for the mass. It is thought that a newly baked loaf, made with the first wheat of the harvest, was presented within the mass on that day. In other words, Lammas is an early harvest festival – early in the sense that it comes right at the start of the harvest. And early in that our usual harvest festival in the autumn is not such an ancient tradition, but rather a nineteenth century twist on a secular harvest home celebration – a party at the end of the harvest. Lammas, on the other hand, dates back to Anglo-Saxon England if not before.

Whatever the origins, it's a good occasion to give thanks (which we can never do enough) and to honour the farmers in our rural churches and wider communities. Bread remains – even in these days of sushi and breakfast bowls, a symbol of the basics... of what we need. So, in the Lord's Prayer, we ask God to *give us this day our daily bread* – give us what we need for today.

This year, we'll be celebrating the festival at Ickleton church on 1st August. We are hoping (if this year's wheat harvest happens in time) to include some locally grown wheat in the bread we break and share in communion.

The Lammas Holy Communion Service is at St Mary Magdalene Church, Ickleton at 11.00am, and yes, we will be singing *Guide me, O thou Great Redeemer...* do join us!
