Ickleton Parish Council Annual Parish Meeting

Thirty residents plus the Chairman and Clerk attended this meeting. Following drinks and nibbles the Chairman gave his annual report covering the past year and the Parish Council's Financial Statement. This was followed by reports from other village organisations and a lively discussion focusing mainly on poor driver behaviour often witnessed by residents and the perennial problem of dog fouling. If anyone wishes to read any of the reports or the Financial Statement they can apply to the Clerk.

Extracts from the Parish Council Meeting on 19 June 2013

Definitive Map Modification Order 2011 – The legal process under which the footpath crossing the railway line from Duxford to Hinxton beyond the end of Water Lane has reached a conclusion. This railway crossing has been closed and it has been decided that the public footpath now runs from Duxford along the western side of the railway line to Hinxton level crossing in Brookhampton Street. The Parish Council are disappointed with this outcome, and has viewed the entire exercise as a waste of time and public money, but we are obliged to accept the decision. What is now regarded as the correct line may now be used by the public, and the County Council is working with the landowner to provide suitable pedestrian and vehicle access at the Brookhampton Street end.

Planning application(s) <u>received from SCDC:</u> Lewis Duke declared an interest and did not take part in the discussion. <u>S/0960/13/FL</u> – Change of use of annexe to form separate dwelling, modifications to existing access and associated fences, gate and hard standing – 66 Abbey Street – Mrs Barbara Cooper. After discussion, it was agreed to recommend: <u>Refusal</u>

<u>S/0973/13/FL</u> – Temporary planning permission for the retention of 4 refrigeration units on the south west elevation of the Sulstan Building – Wellcome Trust Genome Campus, Hinxton – Wellcome Trust. After discussion all agreed to recommend: Approve

Planning application(s) granted by SCDC: <u>S/0755/13/FL</u> — Alterations to main entrance wing; erection of entrance lobby to west elevation garden; replacement plant at roof level and associated works — Sulston Building, Wellcome Trust Genome Campus, Hinxton — Miss Lisa Bowden, Wellcome Trust.

Re-siting of the Basketball Square – The Cricket Club would like to relocate the Basketball Square because it intrudes on the cricket outfield and is a safety hazard for the players. The Club will finance the move. The Parish Council is minded to support the Club, which has yet to suggest a suitable new location. Any suggestions could be made to the Cricket Club.

Litter & Dog Bins – Recreation Ground and Bus Shelters – The Clerk has contacted SCDC to empty these bins in future and is awaiting a response. A stopgap solution is in hand but it may be necessary that you bear with us for a period until a permanent solution is in place. Please report any overflowing bin to any parish councillor. If anyone would like to take this task on, which has been carried out so diligently by Ron Coulson for many years, please contact the Clerk.

Neighbourhood Watch Coordinator - Keith Head announced at the Annual Parish Meeting that his family is moving and he therefore had to resign as the Coordinator. We thank him and Tracy Head for looking after the Neighbourhood Watch in the village for several years. **We are therefore looking for a new Neighbourhood Watch Coordinator and anyone interested should contact the Clerk.**
