Extracts from the Meeting held on 17 July 2013:

Neighbourhood Watch Coordinator – We continue to look for a new Neighbourhood Watch Coordinator. If you are a subscriber to E-Cops, how about playing a small part in spreading knowledge and advice in our community? This is a rewarding role and has been very helpful over the past years in the village. Please contact the Clerk if you are interested.

Open Gardens – Sunday 23 June – As well as very enjoyable, this proved to be a very successful event in raising funds for the Village Hall. The Parish Council wished to record their thanks to the event organisers.

Planning application(s) received from SCDC: Declarations of Interest to be declared.

S/1220/13/FL – two-storey rear extension – 18 Birds Close, Ickleton – Mr & Mrs Edwin Farrow - Approve

S/1289/13/FL – Erection of replacement fencing along the eastern boundary of the site – Hinxtan Hall Ltd., Wellcome Trust Genome Campus, Hinxtan, CB10 1RQ – Miss Lisa Bowden - Approve

S/1303/13/FL – Single storey garden room – Old Farm Cottage, 53 Abbey Street, Ickleton, CB10 1SS – Mr S Clew – All the Councillors declared an interest as Councillor colleagues to the applicant. After discussion and 5 votes For and 2 votes against, the Council recommended - Approve

S/1427/13/FL – Proposed new boundary wall – Rear Norman Hall, 21 Church Street, Ickleton – Mr P Owen – Approve – Councillors would recommend that the wall be rebuilt to its original height.

S/1428/13/LB – Proposed new boundary wall following collapse of existing wall – Rear Norman Hall, 21 Church Street, Ickleton – Mr P Owen – Approve – Comments as above.

Planning application(s) granted by SCDC:

S/0973/13/FL – Temporary planning permission for the retention of 4 refrigeration units on the south west elevation of the Sulston Building - Miss Lisa Bowden, Wellcome Trust Genome Campus

Appeal – Town and Country Planning Act 1990 – Appeal by Heddon Management Ltd. – site at Lane West of 20 Church Street, Ickleton, CB10 1SL. Application Reference: S/S/0167/13/FL – Planning Inspectorate appeal reference: APP/20530/A/13/2198376 – Appeal Start date: 18 June 2013. Replies by: 30 July 2013. The Chairman will send a response to this appeal.

Tree Works subject to a tree Preservation Order or situated within a Conservation Area: 3 Horse Chestnut Trees with damage/disease – Rear Norman Hall, 21 Church Street, Ickleton – Mr P Owen – Approve.

SCDC Local Plan – The draft Local Plan is currently out for consultation. A series of public exhibitions are being held. The nearest being at Spicers Pavilion in Sawston on 2nd September. Details of the exhibition had been circulated and put on the notice board. The first exhibition is on Friday 19 July at Sawston Pavilion and again on 2nd September. The consultation period runs until 30 September 2013.

CCC - Local Highway Improvements 2013/14 – The Parish Council's bid for funding had been successful. We will be given £9,000 towards a scheme for locating two Give-way features in Duxford Road and Frogge Street.

Proposed Foot and Cycle Path between Saffron Walden and Cambridge The Parish Council supports the proposal put forward by Gareth Bevens of Gt Chesterford Parish Council for a foot and cycle path between Saffron Walden and Cambridge. This would go via Littlebury, Great Chesterford and Ickleton to link with the existing cycleway from Hinxton.

Uttlesford District Council is currently funding a feasibility study of the intended route. If the route is found to be feasible, implementation is likely to be some way off.

Police Neighbourhood Panel Meeting – 1st July: Lewis Duke and Liz Gibson attended the meeting. Lewis Duke said it was worth showing the presence from Ickleton. The usual items of speeding and parking remain priorities. Concerns were raised about the number of burglaries that have been happening in the local villages. The police said these were not easy to deter as they are usually committed by non-locals and hard to track down. Evening patrols will check on the Allotments in the village, but they do have limited resources.

SAWSTON MEDICAL PRACTICE

Editor's note: Below is one-off information which patients of the Sawston Practice may like to retain.

Urgent Health Care Services for Patients of Sawston Medical Centre

Between 8.00am and 6.00 pm Monday to Friday

If you have an urgent health issue that you feel requires attention on the same day, but you do not think is life-threatening, your first point of call should be the Surgery.

At Sawston Health Centre there is a rapid access team who are dedicated to deal with all urgent health issues between 8.00am and 6.00pm.

To use this service, you can telephone the reception team, **01223 727555**, who will ask you for some information and help you select the most appropriate service - which may be one of the following:

- you visit the surgery immediately to see a clinician
- the receptionist will book you an appointment to visit the rapid access clinic later that day
- a doctor will call you back as soon as possible after your call to discuss the most appropriate action with you
- the receptionist will make a routine appointment with a doctor or nurse in the next few days

Out of hours services (6.00pm to 8.00am and weekends) "Urgent Care Cambridgeshire"

If you have an urgent health issue when the surgery is closed please telephone the out of hours doctors service, "Urgent Care Cambridgeshire", telephone number **0330 123 9131**. This service is local and led by GPs. A trained clinician will answer and recommend one of the following:

- you visit the 'Out of Hours' clinic at Chesterton in Cambridge
- a doctor will telephone you back as soon as possible after your call
- a doctor will visit you at your home or current location

Addenbrookes Accident and Emergency Department

If your medical condition is something that requires hospital attention, both the Rapid Access team at Sawston and the Out of Hours service at Chesterton will recommend that you visit the Accident and Emergency Department at Addenbrookes Hospital.

If you have an acute life threatening problem, you should call 999.

Routine Appointments

Please note that you may make a routine appointment to see a clinician at the Surgery any time up to four weeks in advance.

Appointments may be made by telephoning the reception, 01223 727555, or you can use the online booking system 'www.sawstonmedicalpractice.co.uk', for which you first need to register by contacting the practice. As well as normal working hours, appointments are available on Monday evenings until 7.40 pm and on Friday mornings from 7.00 am.

Walk in INR Clinic for patients who are prescribed warfarin

This is a new Service at Sawston Medical Centre, starting in August and will operate from 9am – 1pm and 1.30pm – 2pm each Tuesday thenceforth.

You do not need to book, but you will need to complete your INR Form before attending the clinic and bring it with you. When you arrive at the Surgery, please tell the receptionist you have come to attend the walk-in INR Clinic. The receptionist will add you to the list of people attending the clinic that day.

Usually routine INR's can be taken at any time during the week when they are due, but you may at times be asked by Addenbrooke's or your clinician at the Surgery to attend on a specific date and you will then require a normal phlebotomy appointment.
