#### Extracts from the Meeting held on 18 September 2013

<u>Street Lighting – Balfour Beatty PFI Contract</u> – Liz Gibson had contacted Balfour Beatty who informed her that there was nothing further planned for the village until July-December 2015. The timetable can be viewed on the website: www.lightingcambridgeshire.com Full details of the changes to streetlights will be available online nearer the time. Balfour Beatty will also notify the Parish Council and residents prior to the works being undertaken.

#### Planning application(s) <u>received</u> from SCDC:

Tim Pavelin declared an interest in the next item and did not take part in the discussion.

<u>S/1799/13/FL</u> – Part One and a Half, Part Two Side Extension – 28 Church Street – Heddon Management. After discussion, it was a unanimous decision to recommend: <u>Refusal</u>

Councillors were concerned about adverse impacts on neighbour amenity and the conservation area.

#### Planning application(s) granted by SCDC:

<u>S/1726/12/FL</u> – Development of new facilities for Welch's Transport Group incorporating storage and distribution building, vehicle sales, service, MOT and repair building, associated offices, customer car, staff car, truck and crane parking – Moorfield Road, Duxford, Cambs, CB22 4PP – Mr Peter Bovill, Montague Evans LLP, 5 Bolton Street, London W1J 8BA.

<u>S/0759/13/FL</u> – Extension to Electricity Switchroom (retrospective application) – Wellcome Trust Genome Campus, Hinxton – Wellcome Trust Ltd.

**SCDC (Sawston) Local Plan** – The Parish Council is responding to object to developments on the green belt at Sawston on the grounds of inadequate transport links making the proposals unsustainable. Proposed development on brown field land at Sawston would be supported.

There were also concerns about generating rat running through Babraham. Anyone is still able to submit comments to SCDC in writing or on line, the closing date being 14<sup>th</sup> October 2013.

**CCC - Local Highway Improvements 2013/14:** Project to install give-way features in Duxford Road and Frogge Street.

The Project Engineer has advised that funding had been awarded in advance of detailed design work being done. Safety Audit colleagues had now looked at the proposals and were concerned about adequate lighting near the build outs. The conclusion had been that this would not present a problem at the Duxford Road feature, which could be managed without lights, but owing to the large canopy of trees in Frogge Street it was suggested that two lights might be required, which would cost £2,500 each. The funding available would not cover the costs and the Parish Council would be asked to make a larger contribution if they wanted two features as originally planned. The Chairman was asked to write asking for the new costs likely to be involved before the Parish Council could further this project. If anyone would like further information about the project or if they wish to comment, please contact Terry Sadler, Kern Roberts or the Clerk.

**Play Area** – Replacement parts for the Aerial Runway have been obtained that should get it operating properly again. The Parish Council is seeking someone to fit these items and is also attempting to find someone who can repair the broken swing.

**Sizzler Group** - The Parish Council wish to record their thanks to the Sizzler organisers for another enjoyable event in spite of the threat of bad weather.

**CCC** – **Protected Road Verges** – For the past two years, road verges in Grange Road and beyond have been maintained voluntarily by Peter Wombwell who has brought about a noticeable improvement in the variety of wild flowers present in the verges. The County Council have nominal responsibility for these verges but included cutting at inappropriate times and failing to remove the cuttings. Thanks to Peter's efforts the verges are protected nowadays and the Parish Council is very grateful to him.

**Purchase/planting Daffodil bulbs** – It was agreed that the Clerk would purchase a bag of daffodils which would be planted by Tim Pavelin, Clare Driver and herself on the village green

#### SAWSTON MEDICAL PRACTICE

Firstly - Flu jabs. Reminder. The date is Saturday 12th October

Clinicians will be available throughout the day.

Flu jabs can be booked at any time by phone **201223 727555** or in person at the centre (not online)

Please see September ICENE for details concerning who can have flu vaccination free of charge.

**Secondly - Annual Well person Check-Up** All patients between 40-74 years are eligible. This involves an appointment with a practice nurse who will discuss your current health and what you can do to optimise it. It will include blood pressure and blood tests for cholesterol and glucose levels

**Finally** - some brief advice for the coming months. During this period, it is more likely that you may pick up a **cough or cold**. Many of these illnesses do not require coming in to the surgery as there is very little effective treatment we can prescribe, and you may risk infecting others. Here are a few basic treatments you can do for yourself at home to help you get over the illness a little bit faster:

Dink plenty of fluids and keep well hydrated. Get plenty of rest. Eat a healthy low-fat, high-fibre diet, with lots of fresh fruit and vegetables Over-the-counter paracetamol, ibuprofen or aspirin may reduce your symptoms.
