Ickleton Parish Council:

Extracts from the Meeting held on 19 March 2014:

Interpretation Board in memory of Sheila Birch The date for the dedication of the Information Board at Coploe Pit will be **Saturday 12 April 2014 at 4pm**. Everyone who appreciated Sheila's contribution to Community life is invited to meet together with Gerry Birch at Coploe Pit on that day. [Note: Going out of the village on Coploe Road the Pit is just to the right of the road about 400 yards after it crosses over the M.11].

Village Litter Pick – 9th March 2014 This was a very successful event with over 30 bags of rubbish being collected around the village. The Parish Council wish to record their thanks to Clare Driver for organising the event and to SCDC for collecting the bags promptly the next day.

World War I Commemoration The Parish Council encourages people to respond to the Ickleton Society's request for family stories and reminiscences relating to the Great War. It has been suggested to the Parish Council that the sixteen war dead named on the War Memorial could be commemorated by the planting of 16 trees within a hedgerow along the County boundary at the top of Coploe Hill. The Parish Council thinks this is a good idea and is exploring how it can be brought about and what species of trees would best suit the conditions.

SCDC Thermal Imaging Camera for home energy surveying The Camera had been used on 6 houses in the village. It was found to have been a useful exercise and it achieved the aim of revealing weaknesses in the insulation of the properties surveyed, sometimes in quite a surprising and amusing manner. The Parish Council would recommend that more residents have a go at doing this for themselves and we will arrange to book a camera for a further week in November. Details will be given in Icene in due course.

Planning application(s) received from SCDC: Declarations of Interest to be declared.
S/0373/14/FL – Dwelling and Associated Works – Land to the west of 20 Church Street, Ickleton – Heddon Management Ltd. Tim Pavelin declared an interest and did not take part in the discussion. After discussion, the recommendation to SCDC, agreed unanimously by the Parish Council, was: Refusal

Planning application(s) granted by SCDC:
S/0031/14/FL – Garage Conversion and Extension (Use ancillary to main dwelling) – 15 Birds Close, Ickleton – Mr A Paterson

SCDC Consultation to carry out tree works subject to a tree preservation order or situated within a conservation area: C/11/40/054 – Fell Sorbus Xthuringiaca Fastigiata and replace with another tree – 63 Abbey Street, Ickleton – Mr T Sadler. The Chairman stood down and Lewis Duke (Vice Chairman) took that part of the meeting to discuss this application. No objections were raised and it was: Approved.

CCC - Local Highway Improvements 2013/14: No objections had been received to the proposed moving of the 30mph Speed Limit signs in Frogge Street along the road towards Gt Chesterford. The traffic calming measures in Duxford Road are due to be installed before the end of the month and whilst on site CCC Highways should be able to move the signs in Frogge Street.

CCC Local Highway Improvements Initiative 2014/15: The application for funding to reduce the speed limit (to 20mph) had not been successful. Feedback is being sought so that we may strengthen any future bid. In the meantime, the Parish Council remains committed to seeking a 20mph Speed Limit throughout the village. It was decided to carry out speed checks so that further discussions with CCC Highways can be based on recorded speeds. This will be at the Parish Council's expense. There will also be discussions with Highways Officers facilitated by Cllr Peter Topping (County).

Annual Parish Meeting 28 May: We welcome any residents who wish to attend the Annual Parish Meeting, which will take place in the Village Hall on the 28th May at 7.30pm. This is in part a social occasion when refreshments will be provided and it is your chance to speak with Councillors and question them about what is going on.

Sawston Health Centre – Delivery of prescriptions to Ickleton (Tuesdays & Fridays), Duxford & Whittlesford (Daily), Thriplow and Abington (weekly) – Delivery of prescriptions from the Health Centre has been carried out for 15 years by a volunteer driver who is retiring. In the absence of a volunteer driver the service will cease. Please contact the Health Centre if you feel you can help. CCC Abbey Street & Grange Road - road closures for carriageway patching & ironwork adjustment: The patching repairs that have been carried out are part of a process leading up to the roads being surface dressed in the spring. We will do our best to let residents know when this will happen, although we are usually given little or no notice.

News from the Rectory

The journey of the Easter story happens in our churches this year all the way through Holy Week – the week before Easter Sunday, running from the 13th to the 20th. The Sunday before Easter, Palm Sunday, at Hinxtton, we remember Jesus's entry into Jerusalem, where he was joyfully welcomed with waving palms and rode, not on a war horse, but a donkey, coming in peace to bring peace. Peace was not what he found, and as we hear the whole story of his death we are the voices of the crowd, who not only welcome him but condemn him to die.

Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday have short, quiet evening services, the services of Compline, which end each day by preparing us and protecting us for the dark of the night. The services take place on the three consecutive evenings in Hinxtton, Ickleton and Duxford respectively.

On Thursday - Maundy Thursday - in Hinxtton and in Whittlesford, we re-enact the events of the Last Supper, Jesus's last meal with his disciples and the holy meal that we recall every time we have communion. After the meal we remove all the hangings around the altar, leaving a bare table, and switch off the lights, because we are entering the dark part of Jesus's history, the night of his arrest. We pray in the dark as if we were the disciples in the Garden of Gethsemane, keeping a vigil in the church until midnight. Anyone can come and sit quietly.

On Good Friday we remember Jesus's death. We make an Easter Garden with the children in the morning in Hinxtton and then, in Duxford, we recall the events of his dying through the long three hours between 12.00 noon and 3 pm when he was on the cross. In the evening, in Ickleton, we have a service of lament, the service of Shadows (*Tenebrae*), blowing the candles out one by one which symbolise his life until we are left silent in the dark. But on Saturday night in Hinxtton and Sunday morning in all the churches the light comes back, because Jesus is raised to life again. We reaffirm our vows of baptism,

make lots of noise, sing, light the Easter candle from the lit fire of new life, and rejoice that Jesus lives again.

May you and yours arrive at a very happy and blessed Easter.

Jamie Ray, one of our most enthusiastic collectors and a great ambassador for the teenagers of the village, arrived early to help set up which was much appreciated. The collection was organised by The Ickleton Society who provided refreshments and was supported by the Parish Council who did the risk assessment. Thanks to the Village Hall Committee for letting us use the kitchen, CPRE (Campaign for the Protection of Rural England) which kindly lent us equipment, the Wellcome Trust which donated equipment to the village and the volunteers who made the refreshments. A special thank you to Albert Pavelin who empties the dog bins and litter bins every week and puts them out for collection. Well done to all who took part.

Information Board, Coploe Pit, 4pm on Saturday 12 April As visitors to the pit in the last couple of months will have seen, an information board has been erected just inside the pit in memory of Sheila Birch who did so much to maintain the pit as a nature reserve. The Society is proud to have been able to contribute towards this lasting tribute to Sheila and we hope residents will join Gerry Birch, the Parish Council and ourselves at the pit on Saturday 12 April at 4pm for a short informal dedication ceremony.

Walk and Picnic, Bank Holiday Monday 5 May As trailed last month, we are organising a walk and lunchtime picnic similar to the one held last year which was a great success. Once more, thanks to our local farmers, we are planning a route that is not normally open to the public and which will go via parts of Ickleton parish that you may well not have been to before. She will talk about the fight between the military and the farmers to try and keep workers on the land, about soldiers billeted locally, bombing raids and being able to hear the guns on the front even here, and lastly the aftermath of the war. The short AGM will be at 7.30pm, free wine and nibbles at 8pm and the talk will start at about 8.30pm. Free to members (you can join on the night). Non-members are welcome to come along for a small charge of £3.

Founded in 1981 in response to the proposed expansion of Stansted Airport, the Society now has a range of objectives that promote interest in the village and help to maintain our lovely village environment. These include:

- Arranging a wide range of enjoyable social activities. These have included visits to the theatre, wine tastings, themed dances and events, a Christmas party for the village children, talks of local interest with specialist speakers, and the very popular Boxing Day or New Year's Day Walk with a soup lunch afterwards.
- Encouraging high standards of planning in the village and its surrounding area. Monitoring planning applications and maintaining a look out for larger scale developments that could adversely impact our village and making comments on behalf of our members. We have actively campaigned against a proposed eco town and the expansion of Stansted Airport.
- Promoting interest in the history of the village, its historic houses and its people through displays at



village events of historical material and current events, maintaining the village archive (currently one of the finest in the country), talks from specialists, eg on timber framed houses, exchange visits with other similar organisations, villages and towns.

- Maintaining the Society's pages on the village website (www.ickletonvillage.co.uk) and our digital gallery of copies of all the photos in the village archive. We currently have around 4000 photos of the village, village people, events and buildings from the late 1800s to the present day.
- Organising an annual litter picking up day with the involvement of the village children.

The Ickleton Society is funded by subscriptions from villagers. Subscriptions mainly fund the village archive and our website. Photos, documents and other artifacts are kept in archive quality storage so they don't deteriorate over time.

Members do not need to take an active part in the running of the Society or even attend meetings but we invite everyone to the Annual General Meeting in May where, in addition to a summary of the year's business, refreshments and wine are served with the evening rounded off with an interesting talk from an invited guest speaker.
