Ickleton Parish Council:

Extracts from the Meeting held on 16 April

Annual Parish Meeting 28 May: We welcome any residents who wish to attend the Annual Parish Meeting, which will take place in the Village Hall on the 28th May at 7.30pm. This is in part a social occasion when refreshments will be provided and it is your chance to speak with Councillors and question them about what is going on.

Football Clubs (Ickleton, Crocus & Whittlesford Warriors) & Ickleton Cricket Club – Terms for next season:

Football Clubs - The Chairman asked Mr Eldred if he had anything he wished to say. He replied there was nothing. The Chairman said that it had been noted during the litter pick that there was much tape

from the footballers lying around the Recreation Ground and would be grateful if he could ask the players to use the litter bins. Tim Pavelin said the liaison from Crocus (Richard) had been brilliant this season. After discussion it was unanimously agreed to leave the rates for Crocus and Ickleton Football Clubs unchanged for the next season – Crocus - £14.00 and Ickleton - £7.25 and Visiting Teams £20 per match. It was agreed to increase the one off payment by Whittlesford Warriors from £103.50 to £105.00 for the season.

Ickleton Cricket Club – Michael Robinson declared an interest. David Mathias said there had been a clash of the use of changing rooms with the Football Clubs, but they hoped for better liaison from both parties. Spartek FC had played near the cricket square but this had been resolved. The Councillors agreed to the request for permission to erect and leave sightscreens on the Recreation Ground at the Clubs own risk. There would be no charge to Ickleton Cricket Club for the use of the Recreation Ground in view of the maintenance carried out to the pitch and outfield by Cricket Club supporters but visiting teams should pay £20 for use of the cricket ground. The Chairman echoed the sentiments expressed by David Mathias and Martin Smith to the effect that it was very pleasing to see the uses to which the Recreation Field was being put nowadays.

Litter Bins - Three additional litterbins and a replacement bin were installed by SCDC on the Recreation Ground on 20th March. A new bin has been installed in Back Lane to enable dog walkers to dispose of dog faeces, which will have been picked up in a plastic bag.

SCDC Community Pride & Village Hero Awards 2013/14 – 20 March 2014 – Terry Sadler and Jocelyn Flitton together with John and Sue Fowler had attended the event at Cambourne Village College. The sound always lifts my heart, and I'm always delighted and grateful when there is a band of bellringers ready to ring for celebratory occasions, both in the church year and for marking marriages, birthdays, and thanksgivings for people's lives. Learning a little about how bellringing works has also enriched my life – and not only mine. Here's what Christopher Strauli has to say about it – so I am handing over to him for a few more words about this ancient craft in which praise and skill are matched.

'I'd always been intrigued by the prospect of bell ringing but had never found the time to seek it out and since coming to Duxford I'd always enjoyed listening to the bells on a Monday evening when in the garden. A couple of years ago at a Village get together I met Pauline and her casual remark about what she was doing on Monday evening led me to tell her of my interest and her "why not come along and see what it's like?" was all I needed.

The people who make up what is known as the local 'band' of bellringers are as nice a bunch of people as you could meet on a long day's march (as my old landlady was wont to say) and immediately made me most welcome. The individual training I received from our Tower Captain, Maureen, was extremely well implemented with a good deal of patience and charm and the ongoing challenges (both mental and physical) are always surmountable with the encouragement received. Monday evenings are now one of the highlights of my calendar.

Thanks were also extended to the committee members for their collective and individual contributions, particularly Cynthia, who has stepped down as Secretary after many years. Mention was made of the great selection of speakers and outings for the forthcoming year – the Society's 40th Anniversary Year!

ICKLETON SOCIETY

Finding Ickleton’s Lost Roads – walk and picnic, Bank Holiday Monday 5 May.

200 years ago people in Ickleton used tracks to get to the strips of land they farmed in the common fields. Many of them disappeared when the land was enclosed and the present day field system came into being. Peter Wombwell and Lewis Duke have very kindly given us permission to walk a route which will give us views of where tracks such as Three Pin Joint and Five Furling Balk went and along part of the Dell or Hard Way. This event is free and open to everyone in the village and their visitors.

Last year’s walk was about 4 miles. This year we have slightly longer and shorter options. The longer is about 5 miles – meet at Coploe Road/Grange Road junction at 10.30am. The shorter option (about 3½miles) - meet at 11 am at a parking area inside the field on the left of Grange Road, at the top of the rise just beyond Larkhill House (get in touch with me if you need a lift). We’ll have a break for lunch at Rectory Farm where we’ll provide some water and cold drinks. Please remember to bring a picnic. Dogs are welcome as long as they are on the lead. Unfortunately the walk isn’t suitable for pushchairs but we hope lots of children will join us.

AGM and Talk “The Great War in the Countryside”, Wednesday 14 May – remember to come along to our AGM or, if you can’t make that, to the talk afterwards by local historian Helen Harwood about the impact of the First World War on rural communities. The short AGM will be at 7.30pm, free wine and nibbles at 8pm and the talk will start at about 8.30pm. Free to members (you can join on the night). Non-members are welcome to come along for a small charge of £3.

Ickleton at War – our research has unearthed some military records of a number of Ickleton men who served in and survived the First World War – Alfred Baynes, Walter Burgess, Horace Carder, Basil Ellis, Fred Flitton, John Flitton, Frank Human, Albert Page and Fred Rule. We’re lucky to have found these as about 60% of the World War One records were destroyed in a bombing raid in World War Two. That probably means that there were more Ickleton men who served their country. We know from the archive that Will Godfrey, the Clements brothers (Arthur, George, Wilfred, Harold and Reginald) were also in the war, as well, of course, as those who lost their lives and whose names are on the war memorial. If you know of any others, please contact Neil McKillen at 5 Priory Close or by telephone on 530475 so we can add their names to those being commemorated in this anniversary year.

Information Board, Coploe Pit – it was good to see so many people turn out on Saturday 12 April for the dedication of the board to the memory of Sheila Birch. Gerry said that Sheila would have been very touched. To everyone’s great delight, as Gerry finished speaking, a red kite flew right over the pit.

HEDLEY IGGLESDEN 1932 - 2014

I was pleased to be asked to say a few words in church about Hedley. Thanks especially to Elizabeth and the family, and to Sarah Mila, who spoke to Dick and Mary Wombwell.

It was only a few weeks ago, after the storm, that Hedley and I were busy together at The Mill cutting up a large fallen tree with our chain saws, so it seems strange that he is no longer with us.

Hedley was born at 4 Grange Road and attended Ickleton School. His local schooling was interrupted during the war when his father was posted to RAF Wyton. Hedley and his mother later went with him, but as there was room for only one child, his elder brother, Graham, had to stay with the Clements family in Abbey Street.

At Sawston Village College he was a good scholar and his sporting talents soon became apparent.

On leaving school Hedley worked at Abbey Farm, but then moved to Rectory Farm. He was very mechanically minded and drove the first self propelled combine harvester in the village. He was a good worker and could use all the farm machinery. Albert Wombwell [Dick's father] was a good cricketer and knowing Hedley to be a good bowler would call him from his farm work to bowl for him as practice for matches. Dick laughs when he remembers coming home and finding them playing cricket on the lawn, and his father sending Dick to plough the fields!

After Hedley left Rectory Farm he worked at Bonded Structures in Duxford, but he and Graham were often called to Rectory Farm to keep the vermin down, which they were both good at. Hedley was a keen shooting man all his life and a great shot with a 12 bore. Until recently he helped deal with the perennial rabbit problem in our cemetery. In the 1960s Hedley moved to the Clements family home in Abbey Street where he always kept a tidy garden.

The list of Hedley's activities is endless. He played cricket for Ickleton and CIBA for many years and was a great supporter of the present Ickleton Cricket Club. He and Keith Sutcliffe often went to Lord's to watch matches. He and his father played snooker at Whittlesford, and he and Graham were both good darts players. He was a keen indoor bowls player and kept the Ickleton Indoor Bowls Club going. He was an excellent golfer at Newmarket Golf Club where he won many cups. He often went to Newmarket Golf Club for his Sunday lunch, although sometimes he would be invited down Mill Lane by his good friends Ray and Mavis Plumb. He was a regular visitor to the Social Club, latterly with Ray picking him up. He served on The Village Hall Committee and was a regular helper at the Church Fete. He was a longstanding member of the Over Sixties Club where he was known to be a good dominoes player. Many people without a car have been grateful for the errands he ran for them.

He was a popular member of the village coach holidays, although on one occasion when they went to Morecambe to a hotel they nicknamed Fawly Towers, he had a nasty shock when the wardrobe collapsed on him the first time he opened it.

Hedley was a keen photographer and quite recently purchased a state of the art camera. Unfortunately the instructions were on a disc and Hedley did not have a computer. Gordon Woolhouse kindly offered to print it out for him not realising it ran to 160 pages.

I will end with some of the things people said about him:

"Hedley was always placid. He never got upset. Not a bad bone in his body. A kind lovely person. Honest as the day is long. A good character. Good and honest. A great uncle. Genuine. A good man. Can't praise him enough. Ickleton has lost another great character."
