Extracts from the Meeting held on 20th April 2016

The Parish Council wishes to draw your attention to the following:

Open Annual Parish Meeting Wednesday 25 May

All residents will be most welcome to come to the Annual Parish Meeting which takes place in the Village Hall on 25th May at 7.30 pm. Doors will open at 7.00 pm, from which time refreshments will be provided. This is in part a social occasion for the Village. It is also your chance to hear what is going on, speak with Councillors, and draw attention to the issues affecting our community that concern you.

The first Ickleton Annual Awards ceremony (see below) will also take place at the Annual Parish Meeting. Do come along.

Wellcome Genome Campus Expansion Plans

Following the Village meeting with Campus representatives, as reported in last month's Icene, the Parish Council will monitor how the Campus responds to the concerns raised. Representatives of neighbouring Parish Councils (Duxford, Great Chesterford, Hinxton and Ickleton) are meeting on 3rd May in the first of what may become a series of meetings to exchange views on issues of common concern. The Campus plans will obviously feature prominently, as will the evolving Uttlesford District Council Local Plan process, which could bring major developments to or near Great Chesterford and impact severely on our part of South Cambridgeshire.

Bid for an agri-tech hub at Hinxton

Mrs Emma Fletcher, MD of SmithsonHill, the company behind this proposal, attended an open session at the beginning of the meeting to update residents and Councillors, who formed an audience of some two dozen or more. Her presentation was followed by a lively Q and A session. Mrs Fletcher's detailed picture of the problems with the local transport infrastructure was uncontroversial, but there was considerable concern about the lack of firm information about what might be included in the development. The possibility of housing being included on land under the control of SmithsonHill was disclosed for the first time. Mrs Fletcher expected more concrete information to be available in some weeks' time. The Parish Council will monitor the situation as closely as possible.

Recognition of achievements by Ickleton residents or groups

The Ickleton Awards group (three Parish Councillors and three other residents) met and made recommendations for four awards base on suggestions received from residents. These were agreed unanimously by the Parish Council with the financial value being set at £200 per category. Award winners of awards will be notified in advance so they will hopefully be present at the awards ceremony which will form part of the Annual Parish Meeting on 25 May.

20mph speed limit

We are still investigating the possibility of having CCC Highways paint 20 mph roundels on the road surfaces within the Village's 20mph zone. Meanwhile, the Parish Council has ordered 20 mph wheelie bin stickers which will be available free of charge to residents. Please contact me if you are interested.

Defibrillator Training.

A third training session will be held on a Saturday morning with either 21 May or 4 June being the probable date. Those who have already registered for this session will be advised once a date is confirmed but please contact Lewis Duke or myself if you wish to register for this session. The training is more informative and more fun than you might imagine!

Availability of Superfast Broadband within the Village

Connecting Cambridgeshire will shortly be discussing with BT whether there is anything that can be done to help those Frogge Street residents who have been unable to obtain superfast broadband as they have Great Chesterford exchange-only telephone connections. Suggested solutions may take some time to emerge from BT.

"Loud bangs" heard across the Village

Several Councillors have received complaints about this. This is to let you know that it comes from a bird scarer set up to protect crops from pigeons.

New Churchyard gate

As you may have noticed, a new pedestrian gate has been installed. This has been hand made by Adrian Green and many complimentary comments have been received. These will be passed on to Adrian.

But I believe that I am now called by God to uproot and start again in another context which uses me in some different ways.

I am very sad as well as excited, and Ickleton has been a lovely village in which to be your parish priest. Thank you all for everything you have done to make us so happy.

Village Walk and Picnic, May Day Bank Holiday, 2 May

Everyone in the village (and any visitors) is invited to join. Meet at the corner of Birds Close and Coploe Road at 11am. By kind permission of Robert Drage and Peter Wombwell we'll follow a circular route, going up Coploe Hill, across to Valance Farm – then lunch before walking back to the village across the fields. Please bring a picnic and perhaps a rug to sit on. Water and cold drinks available. Dogs welcome on a lead. Parts of the walk will not be suitable for pushchairs. Most of the paths across the fields are not open to the public so this is a great opportunity to see a different part of Ickleton. The full walk is about 4.5 miles. For a shorter walk, you can drive up Coploe Hill, cutting out the initial uphill walk and, by kind permission of Robert Fairhead, park on the hard standing on the right over the brow of Coploe Hill. We suggest you aim to get there by about 11.30am when the groups will meet up.

AGM and Talk “Tales of Tin Alley”, Wednesday 11 May, 7.30pm

A reminder that our AGM will be held in the Village Hall Meeting Room at 7.30pm followed by wine and nibbles. We would like to hear members' views on the possible developments at the Genome Campus and Agri-Tech Hub. At about 8.30pm Derek (Mick) Bristowe will give a talk entitled “Tales of Tin Alley” (Memories of my childhood in Ickleton or what Mr Brett's parrot taught me). Mick, as he is known, came to Ickleton from London in late 1940 and grew up in the village and will share some of his memories of the "midnight baker", the expedition to find the source of the Nile in a petrol tank, and who was machine-gunned in the privy! Proposed nearby developments

Emma Fletcher, Managing Director of SmithsonHill, gave a presentation at the April Parish Council meeting. Unfortunately there was very little hard information about the proposed Agri-Tech Hub to the east of the A1301. Ms Fletcher has been working on transport issues, meeting with local business and research parks and other interested parties to identify problems and potential solutions. However, this all seems to be predicated upon further development in this area including on the 530 acres owned by SmithsonHill. Ms Fletcher's view is that there will only be funding for transport improvements if we accept further development. At one point she revealed that she has had some discussions about building houses on the site. On being pressed further she said this was with businesses rather than planners. I think many of us at the meeting are very sceptical about all of this and perhaps not so surprised that Hanley Grange could be rearing its ugly head again. We hope there will be more information in a few weeks' time.

Geophysical Survey at Abbey Farm, Sunday 1 May

The Society has recently made links with Archaeological Research – a local group which undertakes geophysical surveys. We, and they, were keen to look at areas in Ickleton where there could be archaeological remains and, with the kind permission of Jenny and Lewis Duke, they undertook an initial survey at short notice of some of the land around the farmhouse – the site of Ickleton Priory – on 24 April. We hope news got round so anyone who wanted to, could come and have a look at what was going on.

They are coming back to survey **more of the site on Sunday 1 May** and, again, anyone who would like to come along and look and possibly have a go with some of the equipment is welcome (**11.30 – 3pm**). What happens next will depend on the results but we will publicise them and any further surveys.
