Ickleton Parish Council

Extracts from the Parish Council Meeting held on 17th August 2016

The Parish Council wish to draw your attention to the following

i. Ickleton traffic and the 20mph zone.

An order has been placed for 20mph roundels to be painted on roads within the Village 20mph zone. The cost (in the region of £2,150) will be met from Parish Council funds. Progress has been made towards setting up a Village Speedwatch Team with 6 volunteers attending a preliminary meeting on 17 August with the Speedwatch Liaison Police Officer. Several other residents were unable to attend on this occasion but have expressed interest in taking part. The Officer will be carrying out a safety inspection of possible sites for Speedwatch checks and will then return for equipment training in situ.

ii. Potholes

Many thanks to Icene readers who got in touch to report sites requiring repair and/or emerging potholes. These have been reported and acknowledged by CCC Highways. Residents may also have seen that the Howeys Yard developer has started work to make good the potholes on Back Lane which have been made worse during the last year by heavy vehicles visiting the site.

iii. Icene printing costs

Following on from the article in last month's Icene about the offer of a donation from the Wellcome Genome Campus to cover these costs, the Parish Clerk has received a cheque for £1,000.

iv Village Play Area

We are pleased that the Playground Project Working Group's bid via the Parish Council to SCDC's Community Chest Fund for the purchase and installation of another piece of play equipment – a Double Zig Zag Twister - was successful. We hope to see it in place soon. We are also considering the best way to remove bindweed and encroaching grass from the bark-covered section, as well as renewing the bark once the weeding has been done. The Parish Council has also welcomed a proposal by Ickleton Cricket Club to install, at its own expense, a number of telescopic poles to support 6m high safety netting which can be raised or lowered as required to protect the play area during cricket matches. The poles will be left in position during the cricket season but they will then be removed.

v. Village Noticeboard

The Parish Council has received quotes for the repair/replacement of the Noticeboard and has decided that a new hardwood board is best value for money. Quotes for manufacture/installation will now be firmed up so that we can get this underway as soon as possible. In the meantime, the damaged door will be removed to prevent injury from broken glass. Important Parish Council items e.g. agendas, minutes and financial information can be accessed through the Parish Council website or I can supply hard copies if required.

vi. Stench from rotting crops

Parish Councillors have received a number of complaints about the stench coming from a maize crop rotting under plastic covering in a field beside the concrete track leading up from Frogge Street. This was grown under contract for a bioenergy firm and should have been removed already. The firm is being urged to remove the crop.

vii. CCC Community gritting scheme for Village Footpaths

Every autumn the Parish Council receives a request for volunteers to participate in this scheme. By that time, it is too late to put arrangements in place and hence this unseasonal notification. If anyone is interested in volunteering to grit footpaths in the winter, please contact me for further information. Alternatively a search for Community Gritting on www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk will take you to details of the scheme.

The Courtyard, Abbey Barns, Duxford Road, Ickleton - Lewis Duke. Councillors **agreed by a majority to recommend support** for this application and **did not request that it be referred to the District Council Planning Committee.**

Lewis Duke rejoined the meeting.

iii. S/1194/16/FL and S/1195/16/LB: amended plans for a Single Storey Rear Extension. 3 Church Street.. **Recommendation: no objection**

iv. S/2473/15/FL Non material amendment to a two storey side and rear extension to add an extra conservation roof light in bedroom 3 on the first floor, matching the size and appearance of approved bathroom roof light. 14 Brookhampton Street.

A THREE PARISH FAREWELL TO JESSICA, FRANCIS AND THEODORA

The three parishes of Ickleton, Duxford and Hinxtton came together in Ickleton on Sunday 31st July, to say farewell to the Reverend Canon Doctor Jessica Martin and her husband and daughter, Francis and Theodora Spufford, who in August, move to Ely where Jessica will become Canon Residentiary for Outreach and Education at Ely Cathedral, a post, which she said, could have been designed for her.

Arriving some six years ago as Priest-in-Charge, Jessica, supported by Francis and Theodora, established herself very quickly at the heart of our communities as someone who reached out to everyone, young and old alike: families and people living on their own; church goers and non church goers. Jessica greatly enriched the depth and breadth of our Christian life, establishing a wide range of worship styles and fostering work with young people and those who do not regularly attend church. The large attendance at her final service reflects the love and respect in which she is held.

It's very hard to sum up concisely just how much Jessica has added to the life of the church and community, and the esteem in which she is held. She gave so much of her time to people and had the ability to make everyone feel valued and welcome. She was a committed Governor of Duxford School and took weekly assemblies at which her sense of humour and considerable musical talent was greatly appreciated and will be much missed.

Her last service in Ickleton demonstrated Jessica's profound Christian faith and her ability to make people think, through lively, interesting and challenging sermons. It also did something at which she was an expert, which was to bring together a wide range of people and use the abundance of gifts we have within the three parishes. At the end of the service tributes were paid by representatives of all three churches and Whittlesford and Pampisford, and gifts were given to her, Francis and Theodora.

The service was followed by a wonderful lunch for about 150 people in the Village Hall. Although the service had been emotional, this was an occasion for happy celebration and a wonderful demonstration

of the love and high esteem in which Jessica is held by so many. Thanks go to the many people who helped to make the lunch a success.

Jessica will not be so very far away and we hope very much that she will come back to visit us in Ickleton, to preach in the Church once again. Meanwhile, we have been privileged to have her and Francis and Theodora at the heart of our community and we wish them every blessing and all the very best for the future.

Help for orphans in Kenya

Proceeds will go directly to an orphanage in Kenya run by the charity 'Restart Africa'.

The plight of the orphanage was brought to our attention by Sarah and Paul Crocker who live in Hinxton. Paul recently returned from Kenya where he was working with the National Crime Agency and the Kenyan Police. He visited the orphanage and saw first-hand the magnificent work that Restart Africa are doing to help these abandoned children. The website **www.restartafrica.org** tells you more.

The Restart Children's Centre was set up in 2008 following horrific post-election violence. This resulted in over a thousand deaths and more than 500,000 people being displaced from their homes and villages, with a large number ending up in Gilgil. Many of them were children, who had been orphaned, abandoned, or driven out of their homes by parents who could no longer support them. They suffered starvation, physical and sexual abuse at the hands of gangs on the streets. There are over 100 Children homed there.

Ickleton Cyclists - Battlefields Charity Bike Ride 2016

On **Tuesday September 6th** a group of cyclists from Ickleton and surrounding villages will leave on the start of a 320 mile charity bike ride over 4 days.

The group will ride from Ickleton to Harwich to catch an overnight ferry to Hook of Holland, then along the Dutch coast before arriving in Ypres via Bruges, taking in the Tynecott Commonwealth Cemetery.

In Ypres we will pay our respects at the Menin Gate and we're laying a wreath with the names of those from Ickleton who paid the ultimate sacrifice in both the wars.

The fourth and final day we undertake a 100 mile ride which is our way of commemorating 100 years since the Battle of the Somme. It includes one of the most feared climbs of the Belgian Classic at Geraardbergen and the paved cobbles of the Paris – Roubaix.

Undertaken by amateur cyclists with little or no experience of grand tours the feat is for charity - Help for Heroes, The British Royal Legion and our village Cricket Club who are organising the event.

We're lucky enough to have some fantastic sponsors ahead. We'd like to thank Roger Willmott & Alex Forbes at NFU Mutual Saffron Walden, Liam Brook and the guys at Newdales, Lewis Duke of G.E.&M. Duke, Clare Driver of Domestic Bliss Appointments, all at Team Consulting and Chris Collinson at The Ickleton Lion.

Duxford IWM Air Shows on 10th and 11th September

In the interest of safety the management of the Air Show has provided the following information and directions:

Grange Road, Duxford will be closed on Saturday 10th and Sunday 11th September

The reason for this is 'Secondary Crowding' - which is no longer acceptable at any air show. It is therefore not safe to occupy the fields immediately south of the runway during the air show. If you do so you are putting yourself and the display pilots in harm's way and potentially preventing IWM from continuing with the flying programme and hindering access by emergency services in the event of such a necessity. To this end no public access to these fields is allowed at this time.

Note to residents: IWM scheme for "Neighbours"

As "Neighbours" of Duxford, the IWM generously allows residents of Ickleton and their dependents to **visit the IWM free of charge** at any time, except for Air Shows or other special events.

It's a great place to take children for lunch, with a Lancaster bomber in the play area!

Just turn up at any time and register your name and address. Take a Council tax bill or other paper to show you are indeed a neighbour. You will be admitted then and there FOC, and receive a card valid for 12 months ahead. You can renew at any time.
