### **Important Notice : Bin Collection Day Change**

As you can see above (and hopefully you have also recently received a leaflet from South Cambs District Council), **our normal bin collection day is changing to Tuesday from the end of February.**

As reported last month, the changes to bin collections are happening because SCDC and Cambridge City have agreed, as a cost saving measure, to run a combined service. It is hoped that £700,000 will be saved over the next three years.

**For Ickleton the changeover means we will have two consecutive black bin collections at the end of February, no green bin collection during the month, and only one blue bin collection.**

Many other villages will be similarly affected, as four out of five bin rounds are being changed across the District. After this bit of a hiccup the cycle will settle down to normality in March, with fortnightly green bin collections restored, but with Tuesday being the normal collection day.

**As normal:** Bins must be put out by **6 am** on the designated day of collection. Lids on the bins should be closed, or they may not be emptied.

## **Ickleton Parish Council**

### **Extracts from the Parish Council Meeting held on 18<sup>th</sup> January 2017**

**The Parish Council wish to draw your attention to the following**

#### **1. Tom Dazey**

The Parish Council was saddened to hear the news of Tom Dazey's untimely death. Tom, who lived in Great Chesterford - though his sheep were in Ickleton - was a great and reliable support to us and was ingenious in many of his suggestions for repairing bits and pieces around the Village, particularly in the children's Play Area on the Recreation Field. Our condolences to his daughter Emma. We will miss him.

#### **2. Ickleton Traffic.**

Although it's at a very early stage, we thought that you might be interested to know that problems with the A505 are finally being considered by local councils, in that funding is being obtained via the Cambridge City Deal to enable a study to be made. Since the A505 hardly featured in discussions of infrastructure improvements until now, this is progress – but don't hold your breath.

Meanwhile, we are still pursuing the possibility of purchasing a mobile vehicle-activated speed indicator which could be used as a speed management measure within the Village.

#### **3. Plans for a motorway service station off Junction 10 of the M11.**

MOTO are planning to apply for a motorway service area on the southern side of the A505 on the field between the M11 and the Hunts Road roundabout. This would have the normal range of facilities, including a drive-through coffee shop and a budget hotel. Access would be from the Hunts Road roundabout. We understand that investigations and surveys of and around the site are about to begin. There is no indication as yet as to when a planning application might be made.

There are fears that such a development could threaten the future of flying displays at the Imperial War Museum Duxford.

**4. Uttlesford Planning Policy Working Group.** You may have noticed from the local newspapers that what was expected to be a short pause in the progress of Uttlesford District Council's Local Plan may turn out to be a long pause. UDC have said there will be public consultation on preferred options for new development in the summer. This will give Parish Councils and residents in South Cambs more opportunity to comment if, as expected, a new settlement near Great Chesterford is put forward as an option.

#### **5. Telephone kiosk on Frogge Street**

Apparently we are still on the waiting list to "adopt" our kiosk but this is a very slow process. We will keep a eye on progress. We remain open to suggestions for new uses for the phone box.

#### **6. Electronic bus sign on Frogge Street**

We are very sorry that the Saffron Walden-facing bus sign has been out of action for so long. This has been reported on several occasions with no success. However, CCC has now agreed to send out another electrical engineer to investigate whether it really is an electrical fault and we will continue to keep the pressure on.

#### **7. Plans by SmithsonHill for an Agri-tech Hub off the A1301 opposite Hinxtton**

Terry Sadler and Lewis Duke attended a presentation at Hinxtton on the evening following January's Parish Council meeting. A SmithsonHill team set out their current intentions. These amount to the development of a business park of some 1.2million square feet, employing in time a maximum of 4000

people. Tenants on the site would be limited to agri-tech businesses. Much of the area off the A1301 opposite Hinxtton would be given over to crop field trials. Access on and off the business park would be via a new roundabout on the A1301.

We are told the presentation will be available to view on [www.smithsonhill.co.uk](http://www.smithsonhill.co.uk) and that more information is being issued soon. SmithsonHill are planning to have public engagement events in the spring or summer. We will pass on information to the best of our ability, and we will also let you know what the Parish Council thinks. An actual planning application is unlikely before the end of 2017.

## **8. Ickleton 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Awards Scheme for 2016**

### **Service to the Community of Ickleton**

*To recognise any individual or group that has made a significant contribution to village life*

### **Personal Sporting Achievement** (under-18 and over-18)

*Recognising outstanding individual sporting achievements during the year*

### **Personal Achievement (non-sporting)** (under-18 and over-18)

*For significant personal achievements such as in music, art, dance or fund-raising*

## **Planning information received from SCDC**

Lewis Duke declared an interest in items i and ii below, left the room before discussion and did not vote.

**i. S/0359/16/FL** Variation of condition 2 (Approved Plans) to planning permission S/0359/16/FL Abbey Barns, Duxford Road. (Abbey 2000 Property Management).

**Agreed unanimously to support this variation of condition**

**ii. S/3001/16/VC** Variation of condition (Approved Plans) of planning permission S/1955/16/FL Abbey Barns, Duxford Road.

Newly revised plans showed 21 car parking spaces although original approval had indicated a maximum of 17 permissible. The proposals for additional parking would move part of the western boundary towards Abbey Farmhouse and its adjacent barn, both listed buildings, by a distance of several metres. It was agreed therefore to strongly recommend that the proposals be reviewed by the Listed Building Officer in respect of impact upon the listed buildings, and that his or her views be taken into account when this application is considered by the Planning Officer.

**Agreed to object but not to request referral to SCDC Planning Committee**

iii. **S/3488/16/LB** Refurbishment and renovation works Wellington House, 37 Church Street.

**Agreed unanimously to support this application**

**Notification of a decision from the Planning Inspectorate**

APP/W0530/W/16/3153840. The Glebe, Frogge Street, Ickleton. Appeal upheld and planning permission granted for a new detached dwelling.

### "Youth In" - reaching out of young people exploring faith

It's a well-recognised fact that the average age of the church population, like the general population is increasing. This presents many challenges for the church, not least that many of our activities and services are rather traditional and perhaps not completely young-person friendly! We've been thinking about this for a while in Ickleton, Duxford and Hinxton and have created a new initiative for young people interested in exploring spirituality, Christian faith and its relevance in the modern world.

The "Youth In" initiative is run by a dedicated part-time youth worker – Emma Perkins – who will create and run regular sessions with young people aged over 9 years, designed and structured to make them really relevant and aimed at discussing the things they think are important.

The funding for this is being provided from a dedicated educational fund from Ickleton church, the Granta deanery and the Diocese of Ely. We hope that this initiative will grow in the future and expand across a number of local villages to provide a rural hub supporting young people as they explore aspects of faith and belief.

This programme complements the existing activities for children such as Sunday School held at Ickleton on the first Sunday of every month at 10am and Messy Church held at 10am on the second Sunday of the month at Lacey's Way Community Centre, Duxford.

## **Cynthia Rule 1929 – 2016**

Cynthia sadly died on 22<sup>nd</sup> December 2016. She was a very active village member much loved by family and friends.

Cynthia was born in Abbey Street, Ickleton in 1929, the eldest of three children born to Cyril and Constance Say who ran a grocery and drapers shop located opposite the Ickleton Lion. She lived in Ickleton the whole of her life, marrying a local lad, Charles Rule, whom she had known since she was fourteen. They spent their early married years in Mill Lane later moving to 'Hiland' in Frogge Street and ultimately to 'Saffrons' also in Frogge Street.

Cynthia ran Ickleton post office for 20 years, originally from her in-laws' premises, 'The Beehive' in Frogge Street, moving to an annex at 'Saffrons' - interestingly the annex had been the original post office many years previously.

Apart from post office duties Cynthia was heavily involved in numerous social activities in the village

including being a member of the Women's Institute for 50 years, the 'Over 60's for many years, and the 'Ickleton Popsies'. She was also involved in money raising events, often co-opting family support for the church such as village fetes etc.

The Ickleton Popsies, back in the 1970's, was an old time entertainment group singing and performing sketches, mostly in the village hall but sometimes visiting other villages with the intention of having a good time whilst raising money for many of the village charities.

Her time at each of these groups usually included being heavily involved with the various committees, and in line with her enthusiasm for gardening she served as secretary of the Chesterford & District Garden Society for many years. She also took on being 'booking secretary' for the old village hall for several years until it closed, and she delivered the Icene in Frogge Street for many years.

Her family and many of her friends deemed her the oracle - as the fount of all knowledge, particularly gardening issues.

Cynthia was very much a village person; Ickleton and the community were very important to her. She was always delighted when people dropped in for a cup of tea and a piece of cake. She felt herself truly blessed to have such wonderful friends and neighbours who continued to visit and care for her till the week she died.

Her family would like to pass their sincere and heartfelt thanks to all those who sent messages of condolence following their sad bereavement.

Thank you to all those who attended the funeral service and gave donations to Ickleton Church.

Also a special thank you to her neighbours and friends who helped to keep an eye on her and support her through her long and difficult illness, which was hugely appreciated by her and her family

The dinner was served up at 5 o'clock in good style by the new host Mr. Godfrey, jun. On the cloth being withdrawn, the usual loyal and patriotic toasts were proposed and responded to. Hearty good wishes for the welfare of the house under its new management were freely expressed by all present. Mr W Godfrey on behalf of his son was the first to respond, the host following in a neat and appropriate speech. Some capital songs and some excellent music were given at intervals and a very enjoyable evening was spent...”
