2. Uttlesford Draft Local Plan and the proposed "Garden Settlement" by Great Chesterford.

You have just a few days left to object – consultation closes 4th September.

Opposition to this has escalated greatly during the last month - as you will have noticed from the TV and local press as well as from the banners displayed at prominent points around the Village by the newly-formed protest group (<http://www.stopnugv.org.uk/>). Leaflets have also been distributed to every household by the Ickleton Society.

There is concern to retain the rural nature of this part of South Cambridgeshire. The proposed settlement, being situated right up against the boundary between Uttlesford and South Cambs, seems to pose more problems to us rather than to the District of Uttlesford. The settlement would be located on elevated and rising land and would potentially be highly visible, especially in long distance views. There are fears of an increased risk of flooding here and in neighbouring villages. Our sewage arrangements are at capacity already. As for the effect on traffic, we are all aware that our local roads, especially the A505 and A1301, are under severe pressure and, without significant improvements, putting the vehicles associated with a new town of 5000 houses onto those roads will inevitably make matters much worse. There would be more rat-running through Ickleton and Duxford.

Local Parish Councils have been working closely together as well as with South Cambs District Council to highlight the issues that concern us. The consultation ends at 5pm on Monday 4 September and the Parish Council will submit a robust response. It is important that as many people as possible respond individually as well. Don't just leave it to others. If you are worried about this proposal, please send in your comments - the leaflets give you ideas of what you might say.

3. Wellcome Trust Genome Campus Expansion Plans. We have been sent details of the new core consultant team and told that the team will be expected to interact with local representatives. A community engagement programme, scheduled to start in September, is planned.

4. Plans for motorway service station off Junction 10 of the M11. Nothing new to report this month.

5. SmithsonHill plans for an AgriTech Hub off the A1301 opposite Hinxton. Again, nothing new apart from a charm offensive in the Cambridge press about how this will include a food hub for Cambridge Sustainable Food (in essence a distribution centre for locally grown food). Rumours have been circulating that SmithsonHill is to submit a planning application this month.

6. Sawston Trade Park (Iconix). The Parish Council submitted an objection to SCDC concerning the Large Major Planning Application for the Iconix site. This objection covered the size of the proposed development, its adverse impact on the local neighbourhood and, above all, the scheme's transport implications and the inadequate improvements proposed in the Application. Other Parish Councils have also objected to the proposal.

7. Telephone Kiosk on Frogge Street

As several Parish Councillors were on holiday at the time of the August meeting, it was agreed to hold over discussion about the future use of the telephone kiosk until the next meeting.

North Uttlesford Garden Community – if you've not already done so, please, please respond to the consultation by 4 September.

You will by now, we're sure, have seen the flyers and the information in previous editions of Icene. If this goes ahead it will have a huge impact on Ickleton and the surrounding area as it will eventually be a town of 5000 houses. The result will be a big increase in traffic; pressure on local services such as schools, doctors, Addenbrooke's, sewage treatment, parking at train stations and seats on busy trains; an increased risk of flooding and to the amount of rainfall that reaches the Cambridge aquifer. Built on a hillside, it will be visible for miles around and light will pollute the night sky. Many of the downsides from this development would fall on the residents of South Cambridgeshire.

Uttlesford is supposed to plan to meet its housing needs but a settlement in this location right at the northern edge of the District will do little to service employment growth in Uttlesford district which is acknowledged to be around Stansted and the resulting housing needs. Instead it will encourage commuting to Cambridge and London and indeed Bidwells are promoting this site as meeting housing needs resulting largely from growth of the biotech clusters which are mostly in Cambridge City and South Cambs even though Cambridge City and South Cambs Councils have made provision for the necessary housing in their Plans.

Agri-Tech Hub – as if the North Uttlesford Garden Community wasn't enough, it is rumoured that a planning application will be made this month by SmithsonHill for the Agri-Tech Hub at Hinxton. You can check by visiting <http://plan.scambs.gov.uk/swiftlg/apas/run/wphappcriteria.display> and searching on Hinxton. SmithsonHill's plan is to have 4000 employees working at what will, in essence, be a business park. It is another development which would concrete over good agricultural land and lead to more traffic congestion and rat running through our village if it goes ahead. If and when a planning application is made, we will provide some guidance on how you can make comments on it and points that you might wish to make to the S Cambs Planning Team.

Did you know? It was in September 1848 that Ickleton's Roman Villa was first excavated by the Hon. R C Neville, later 4th Baron Braybrooke. As well as discovering the remains of foundations and walls of a large villa, his team discovered furnaces, flues and baths pertaining to hypocausts, coins and other remains. Duxford Air Festival - Saturday 23 and Sunday 24 September – Safety Information

Ahead of the Duxford Air Festival on Saturday 23 and Sunday 24 September, IWM Duxford has released some important safety information that it wishes to share with local residents:

It is not safe to occupy the fields surrounding IWM Duxford during the air show. If you do so you are putting yourself and the display pilots in harm's way and potentially preventing IWM from continuing with the flying programme.

In support of this, and to ensure that the emergency services have clear, unhindered access, **Grange Road will be closed on Saturday 23 and Sunday 24 September.**

The fields around IWM Duxford are private property and there is no public access to these fields at any time. IWM will continue to monitor these measures and ensure where possible that the disruption to the local community is kept to a minimum. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

Please also note that two of the aircraft teams displaying as part of the Duxford Air Festival will be using pyrotechnics and simulated explosions within their flying displays.
