Ickleton Parish Council :

At the Annual General Meeting held on 16th May Terry Sadler was elected as Chairman and Lewis Duke as Vice-Chairman for the coming year. Areas of responsibilities and membership of working parties were also agreed. These will be displayed on the village notice board and website.

Some items discussed at the Parish Council meeting held on 16th May:

Super fast Broadband – Communications from the County, District and Cambridgeshire Acre had been received urging everyone to support the ‘Get Cambridgeshire Connected’ campaign. To do this, all you need to do is log onto the website www.connectingcambridgeshire.co.uk It only requires your postcode and landline phone number and whether you want better broadband at home, work or both. It will only take you a minute, but it could save you hours in future – and, if you run a business, enable you to become more profitable.

From the District Councillor’s report: A new home in Ickleton has been crowned as the best property in East Anglia for 2012. Chapel House, a four-bedroom home in Frogge Street on the site of the former dilapidated chapel, scooped the top award at the East Anglia local authority building control (LABD) building excellence awards.

Planning application(s) received from SCDC: Declarations of Interest to be declared.

S/0588/12/FL – Construction of a Detached Garage at the rear of the Dwelling – 33 Church Street – Mr K Thorn. Approve At the request of SCDC the recommendation had to be submitted by 4th May 2012. This was therefore dealt with by e-mail.

S/0802/12/FL – Single Storey Rear Extension (Revised Design), Alterations and Replacement Gate/Fence – 1 Frogge Street Approve

S/0803/12/LB – Single Storey Rear Extension (Revised Design) and Internal and External Alterations – 1 Frogge Street Approve

Pre-Planning Application submission re. Abbey Farm Barns – Lewis Duke declared a prejudicial interest.

The Chairman invited Lewis Duke to explain the plans he is shortly to submit to SCDC. Mr Duke then left the room whilst Councillors discussed the plans. Lewis Duke rejoined the meeting. The Chairman said the Councillors would give their unanimous support subject to the application being made in proper form. They felt there were no negative impacts regarding the Listed Buildings and were pleased to see the return to use of a derelict building.

S/2484/11 – Two-storey detached dwelling and garage – site r/o Norman Hall, Church Street

S/0337/12/FL – New Agricultural Grain Store – The Heath, Rectory Farm, Grange Road

S/0555/12/FL – First Floor Side Extension to form Bedroom – 8 Southfield

S/0374/12/LB – Part replacement roof and guttering – Gurner House, 20 Church Street

Purchase of Jubilee Oak Tree + plaque – Sian Wombwell has ordered from Barcham Trees a Quercus Palustris Oak Tree, which will be 3m tall, together with a planting kit.

The Clerk had purchased the plaque and C Frankau had set it on a stake ready to be put in the ground. A formal planting will take place as part of the village's Diamond Jubilee celebrations.

Citi7: Stagecoach has produced new timetables as from 10th June. The new service will include a stop at the Bus Shelter at the top of Abbey Street. David Lilley reported he felt it was really good news from Ickleton's point of view.

Litter and Dog Bins – In view of increased use being made of the Recreation Ground, by footballers and cricketers, it was felt that more litterbins should be provided. In addition, further signage discouraging fouling by dogs is considered necessary as well the provision of a couple of new dog bins in Back Lane area. Hopefully these increased facilities will go some way towards addressing a perennial nuisance. The Clerk will carry out the necessary research as to costs etc.

Wellcome Trust – The Parish Council has been advised that the Trust's plans to install a Wind Turbine have been shelved indefinitely. A new building, the EBI Technical Hub, will be going up on campus, beginning in June and completing in November 2013. Contractor's vehicles should not be coming through the village and those doing so should be reported to Wellcome with a description, quoting if possible the number plate, as they would be in breach of undertakings with Wellcome. An Archaeological Exhibition is planned to take place in June, which will display the finds from the preparatory dig held prior to the new building going up. The campus is organising publicity in June.

Parish Council Vacancy. Following Sheila Birch's resignation there is a vacancy on the Parish Council. By the time you read this, a notice will have been displayed as required by law on the notice board. If a by-election is not called for, the Parish Council will seek to fill the vacancy by co-option. ALL CHANGE ON THE BUSES

What a relief - Ickleton still has an hourly service

Stagecoach's decision to change the Citi7 service south of Sawston came as a complete surprise. The County Council had planned to withdraw subsidy from September, but Stagecoach couldn't wait that long in limbo and acted to change its scheduling. A stopgap service has been set up for Whittlesford, and Hinxton which would otherwise lose all its services.

The new timetable will operate from **10th June**. The new Citi7 service between Cambridge and Sawston will run on weekdays at a 20-minute interval, with an hourly service which goes on to Saffron Walden, passing through Ickleton.

The difference for Ickleton is that the Saffron Walden service will pass through Duxford rather than Hinxton – so Brookhampton Street's loss is Abbey Street's gain.

Stagecoach will be running this service with no subsidy, so the County Council has no say in its route or timetable. And, as a commercial service, it really will be '**use it or lose it**'.

NEWS FROM THE RECTORY

I happened to catch a snippet of the Radio 4 programmes Neil Macgregor is presenting on Shakespeare's England, and heard him talking about the sense of stability Elizabeth 1's subjects had simply because she had been Queen for half a century. We have something of that same stability; our own Queen Elizabeth has provided it for 60 years. Perhaps our constitutional monarchy gives us a kind of buffer against a constantly changing political scene, some deep roots which allow us to meet our crises with the kind of calm which emerges from a sense of clear identity. And we are lucky in having a monarch who has always taken her duties and responsibilities with great seriousness.

The Book of Common Prayer offers prayers, morning and evening, for the Queen's Majesty, and prays for Queen also in its Communion Service. From time to time, as I pray these prayers, I find myself noticing that a happy peculiarity of constitutional monarchy is that as Governments come and go I can continue to pray for the good of the country at one remove from the specific policies of any of them. That non-partisan distance seems to me to be very important – an identity which can't be eroded by political decisions from right or left - and a blessing of our national constitution for which we can be thankful.

ICKLETON SOCIETY

Visit to the old Sun Inn and former YHA, Saffron Walden, 28th July - we have arranged a very special visit to part of the old Sun Inn and the former YHA in Saffron Walden. Both buildings are now in private ownership, are amongst the oldest buildings in Saffron Walden, contain a wealth of historic features and are Grade I listed. The visit is on Saturday 28th July. We will meet at the old Sun Inn, 25-27 Church Street (just down from Lankester Books which occupies other parts of the Inn) just before 2.00 p.m. when Douglas Kent will show us round the part of the inn (formerly 2 cottages) he bought in late 2009 and is renovating and we will then move on to the former YHA at 1 Myddylton Place where we will have afternoon tea (I understand this includes delicious home-made sandwiches, scones and cakes), a presentation about the renovation work undertaken by Tony and Julia Chapman and a tour. The cost is £12 for members and £13 for non-members which covers the cost of a gift for Douglas Kent, afternoon tea and entrance to 1 Myddylton Place. We expect to finish about 5.30 p.m. This is a unique opportunity to visit these properties and to see 25-27 Church Street in the course of renovation. Please let me know if you would like to reserve places on the visit.

The visit to the old Sun Inn is in return for a visit to Ickleton houses and the Church by the Essex branch of the Society for the Protection of Ancient Buildings (SPAB). Douglas Kent is the Technical Secretary of SPAB. We're grateful to Steve Parsons for help in organising this visit and for those members who are showing their homes and the Church to SPAB Essex later this month.

BBC Radio Cambridgeshire programmes about Ickleton – recently we were featured on the Radio Cambridgeshire breakfast programme as part of their 30th anniversary celebrations. They have kindly given us permission to reproduce, on CD, 2 wonderful programmes they made about Ickleton in 1984 and which featured Mary Bristowe, Leslie Lilley, Elisabeth Wamsley, Rosemary Hayes, Graham Wallis, David and Jean Whitaker, Eileen Godfrey and Joe Bibby talking about their lives and Ickleton as it was in 1984 and its history. The piece broadcast on 1st May included extracts from those programmes as well as me talking about our oral history project and David and Jean Whitaker reminiscing about the 1984 programme and changes in their lives since then. We hope to have the CD available for sale soon at a cost of just £5. It will have a lovely cover of Ickleton and will make a perfect gift or memento. Please let me, or any other member of the Committee, know if you'd like to reserve a copy.

What's new on our website (<http://www.ickleton.org.uk/gallery/main.php>) – we have recently added copies of a few documents that are in the archive including, with the Diamond Jubilee in mind, copies of the programmes for Ickleton's celebrations for the coronation of King Edward VII, the Silver Jubilee of King George V and the Coronation of King George VI. Have a look at the gifts that were given to the children (buns and oranges, and a tea at Caldrees Manor) and villagers (beef, beer, tea and 2 shillings for pensioners) and the sports (tilting the bucket, boot and shoe race – black boots only!, egg and spoon races for married women and for single women, treacle bun race, and thread and needle race) and entertainments (processions of the fire engine, decorated bicycles, dances and, of course, bonfires on Coploe Hill). You can easily find these, and more, in the Recent Additions album.

PAUL BAKER 1962 – 2012

It is with much sadness we inform you of the death of Paul Baker of South Lodge, Ickleton, due brain tumours caused initially by skin cancer.

Born within the sound of Bow bells, he was an only child brought up in Enfield. Paul moved up to Leeds to study Classics at the University. Obtaining a 2.1, he then joined Spicer & Pegler to undertake his articles in accountancy. Married in 1984 to Elizabeth they remained in Leeds until 1987, then after a stay in Barkway, they moved to South Lodge in 1991.

Between them they established highly successful businesses, one being the Country's first shopping centre marketing and promotion consultants, another being the company which gold plated The Dome of the Rock in Jerusalem, and one for which Paul is best known locally being HSA, the Chartered Accountancy practice based in Great Chesterford.

Their son James was born in 1999 which Paul always described as his best 'achievement'. James shared with Paul the love of trains, planes and automobiles, and a passion for collecting models and associated magazines.

Paul flew on Concorde, stayed in the world's finest hotels, mixed with royalty and celebrities, generally enjoying life to the full. Paul always put 100% effort into everything he did, collecting, hobbies, education and work. He was a terrific family man who worked tirelessly for 'Team Baker'.

He was described recently as a great humanitarian, as he helped to improved lives and fortunes of people in Chernobyl, Evander and here at home. Whoever met him could not fail to be impressed by his devotion to duty, family, friends, work colleagues, clients and the businesses.

A deeply religious man, Paul held on fast to his faith and the teachings thereof, and used those beliefs to assist everyone who came into contact with him. Whilst he took business life very seriously he had a huge sense of fun and his friends will miss his pranks and infectious laugh.

He loved Liz, James, their dogs and home life. He loved the finer things in life, travel, food and drink. He was a highly cultured man. He loved his friends and Ickleton and he loved helping people.

Paul will be greatly missed. However, the family, his work partners and colleagues will strive to keep alive his ethics and policies and the love of changing the fortunes for the better of all those he met.
