**Some items discussed at the Parish Council Meeting held on 17<sup>th</sup> October 2012:**

**Replacement Editors of Icene** – We are pleased to announce that John Williams has volunteered to take on editing and producing the Icene on a six-month trial basis as from December 2012. His is the only concrete offer to be made to the Parish Council to date. The Parish Council was delighted to take him up on his offer.

A presentation will be made to David & Monica Lilley at 7.00 p.m. prior to the Parish Council meeting on 21<sup>st</sup> November 2012.

**Proposed 20mph Speed Limit** – This remains under consideration by the Parish Council, assisted by a focus group of residents. Discussions also continue with CCC Highways. A consultation exercise will take place before any binding decisions are made. In the meantime Kern Roberts would be pleased to receive your views – [kern.business@hotmail.co.uk](mailto:kern.business@hotmail.co.uk)

**Super fast Broadband – LAST CHANCE TO REGISTER!** – Cllr Stone (County) mentioned in his report that 106 out of 318 premises in Ickleton had now registered; this equates to 33.3% and is above the county average. Registration ends on **30<sup>th</sup> November 2012**. **SCDC Community Pride & Village Hero Awards** – The Chairman and three members of The Sizzler Group attended this ceremony on 28<sup>th</sup> September 2012. The Parish Council wished to congratulate The Sizzler Group in sharing the second prize for the Community Pride Award. It was also noted that Michael Butler (Duxford) won third prize in the Village Hero Award.

**Planning application(s) received from SCDC:** None

**Declarations of Interest to be declared.** Lewis Duke declared an interest in the pre-application plans for the Methodist Chapel. Terry Sadler and Lewis Duke declared an interest in the tree application for 64 Abbey Street (purely as neighbours).

**Pre-application plans for Methodist Chapel, Abbey Street:** The Chairman invited Lewis Duke to explain his proposed plans. Mr Duke handed out copies of the proposed plans for a 3-bedroom dwelling. He mentioned that the side extension would be demolished and that the plans showed a rear extension and small garden, which were outside the village envelope but on land that he owned. The area at the front, currently used for parking, is part of the former Chapel premises and will form an amenity area for the proposed dwelling adjacent to the footpath. He invited Councillors to make any comments or ask questions. The plans will shortly be submitted to SCDC.

**Application to carry out tree works subject to a tree preservation order or situated within a conservation area:**

C/11/40/054 – Reduce crowns of English Walnut by 4 metres and height by 2 metres and self sown Sycamore by the same amount – 10 Butchers Hill – Approve

C/11/40/054 – Remove (fell) multi-stem Hazel to rear of property due to close proximity to building, excessive shading and low amenity value – 64 Abbey Street – Approve

C/11/40/054 – Re-pollard row of 7 Limes and Ash Tree - Remove stem back to trunk overhanging croquet lawn – Harlequin House, 43 Abbey Street – Approve

**Planting daffodil bulbs – 6<sup>th</sup> October 2012** – Tim Pavelin, the Clerk and Clare Driver had planted a sack of bulbs around the trees in the Recreation Ground and in the corners of the Play Area. It was agreed to purchase some more bulbs next year to plant somewhere in the village.

**CCC - Cambridgeshire Future Transport (Buses) Meeting:** As from 4<sup>th</sup> November, the Citi7 buses will no longer be going through Pampisford. It is hoped this will improve the time keeping as access onto the A505 had been delaying the buses. The 7a extension service is proposed to go to the Babraham Park & Ride, this will also connect with Citi7 service. The Chairman will submit comments supporting this proposal. There is a possibility that the 101 service on Tuesday will be withdrawn.

**Cambs. Police – Neighbourhood Police Meeting – 1<sup>st</sup> October 2012:** Lewis Duke and Jocelyn Flitton attended the meeting. Concerns regarding speeding and parking on pavements was raised. The police reported that anti social behaviour was down, but they were aware that Halloween and Bonfire Night were coming up. Local police forces are having to get to grips with funding cuts. Consequences for our communities are not yet clear, but are likely to be noticeable. The next meeting is on 7<sup>th</sup> January 2013.

## **INTRODUCING THE LOCAL WOMEN'S AID OUTREACH WORKER**

This year the Locality Team and Seedlings Children's Centre (both part of the County Council's children's services), are funding a Women's Aid outreach project in the Sawston and Linton area.

The outreach worker's name is Anne Keyes and she works for Women's Aid –an independent charity run by women to help other women and children who are affected by domestic abuse.

For four days a week Anne works at The Women's Aid outreach office in Cambridge ☎01223 361214 and now she also works for the equivalent of one day a week in the Sawston and Linton area to see families locally, so that they don't have to travel into Cambridge.

Anne will establish a support group for survivors and meet women one-to-one to give advice. She will also run workshops regarding issues such as housing and benefits, legal advice with a fully trained solicitor, training and back to work, debt management and budgeting, at John Huntingdon's Charity in Sawston on Thursdays 11.00 a.m. - 1.00 p.m. (dates to be announced).
