### **Extracts from the Meeting held on 17<sup>th</sup> February 2016**

**The Parish Council wishes to draw your attention to the following:**

#### **Wellcome Genome Campus: Expansion Plans**

A meeting with Martin Dougherty, Chief Operating Officer of the Wellcome Genome Campus, will have been held in the Gordon Woolhouse Meeting Room in the Village Hall on Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> February (just after the publication of this Icene Bulletin).

If you were unable to attend, or have questions that were not answered at this meeting, the Chairman of Great Chesterford Parish Council has kindly extended an invitation to Ickleton residents to attend a

presentation from a Campus representative in Great Chesterford Community Centre at **7.30pm on Wednesday 9th March.**

## **Agritech Hub**

Although the meeting on 24<sup>th</sup> February was to be confined to discussion of the Wellcome Genome Campus's long-term development plans (for the land they own on the other side of the A.1301), the Parish Council has agreed that it would be helpful to invite Mrs Emma Fletcher to an open session at the beginning of the Parish Council meeting on 20th April. Mrs Fletcher is the Managing Director of SmithsonHill the partnership behind the proposal for an Agritech development to be situated on land on the opposite side of the A1301 from Hinxton. She is very active at present trying to bring together businesses and local authorities to support initiatives to achieve improvements to the local transport infrastructure.

### **Cemetery Chapel**

Repairs are needed to the side extension of the Cemetery Chapel and the Parish Council has agreed to accept a quotation from Landmark Restoration for this work. However, they will need a generator for this so if anyone has one they could lend, or could rent to us at a reasonable rate, please do get in touch.

### **New advertising sign overlooking the M11**

The advertising hoarding is still standing at the side of the Grange Road bridge over the M11. However, the Chairman has managed to establish that no permission was given for the sign to be erected. Now Highways England has to confirm that it is on its land and then perhaps there will be some action

### **Blocked drains on Frogge Street**

There have been two instances in recent months when Anglian Water has had to be called out to unblock drains at different places in Frogge Street. According to the visiting engineer, both the most recent blockage and the much bigger one at the end of 2015 at the corner of Frogge Street and Abbey Street were caused by wet wipes or make-up wipes being flushed into the main sewerage system. As the cost of call outs falls on all Ickleton residents through charges by Anglian Water included in our

water bills, the Parish Council would be grateful if everyone could take note of this problem and make alternative disposal arrangements.

### **Availability of super-fast broadband within the Village**

The Chairman has progressed the issue of Frogge Street residents unable to access super-fast broadband with the Project Director of Connecting Cambridgeshire. It appears that eight houses are connected directly to the Great Chesterford exchange and therefore do not have access to the service routed through the new green cabinet behind the Frogge Street bus shelter.

The Project Director is taking this up with BT Openreach.

### **Defibrillator**

The date of the third training session, most probably to be held in March, has yet to be finalised. Those who have expressed an interest in attending will be contacted. For any queries, or if you want to volunteer, please contact Lewis Duke or myself.

### **Grass Verges in Abbey Street**

Cllr. Topping has agreed to arrange an on-site meeting for himself, the Chairman and Mr Laughlin of CCC Highways. A community effort in the spring is still intended repair the damaged verges.

### **Delay in road/path sweeping**

We have been advised by the Head of the SCDC Street Cleansing Unit that delays in sweeping our roads and paths are due to a shortage of qualified drivers with existing staff having to be redeployed to rubbish bin emptying duties. Hopefully the recruitment of new drivers will allow normal services to be resumed in the not-too-distant future.

### **Recognition of achievement from the Parish Council to Ickleton residents or groups.**

A number of nominations have now been received but it is still possible for you to submit nominations to me as the deadline is 31 March. Winners of sports-related awards will be recognised through a donation to their club/organisation while those whose contributions to our community have been recognised will either receive a voucher to be spent locally or, if they prefer, can ask for a donation to be made to a charity of their choice. ## **News from Neighbourhood Watch**

Whilst we know that crime in Ickleton and the surrounding area is low, it is still important for all of us to be vigilant and report suspicious behaviour. In South Cambs the most common crimes are criminal damage to vehicles and properties and theft from sheds and garages.

Fraud targeting the elderly and vulnerable members of the community is an issue and here I detail a recent incident reported in the Fen Ditton area. An elderly person received a telephone call from someone who purported to be from their GP surgery asking for an appointment to discuss their mobility needs. During the appointment, the older person was persuaded to buy mobility aids which were unnecessary, inappropriate and expensive. If you receive a call like this, please check with your GP surgery first before agreeing to a visit.

How safe is your house from burglars. Is it built of brick, twigs or straw? Cambridgeshire Police has recently launched the 'bad-wolf' test. This is an online quiz and takes two minutes to complete. A score of brick, twigs or straw is given, anyone who has a straw rating is given an email contact address and encouraged to get in contact with police to do a full home security survey. If you have any concerns or need to report suspicious behaviour to police then dial 101. As always you can dial 999 if something is happening then and there and you need an emergency response. As always be vigilant and stay safe.

## News from the Rectory

Easter falls early this year, so March is packed - but spring has come early too!

On Friday 4th March the 'Women's World Day of Prayer' is taking place in All Saints, Great Chesterford, at 2.30 pm. In Ickleton a couple of days later we have a special service for Mother's

**Day on the 6th, at 10.30 am in the church, with coffee and cake beforehand-** come along and give thanks for your mothers!

It's also a baptism so it will be particularly joyful, and its theme will be nurture and care of all kinds. The week we call Holy Week (the week before Easter Sunday) is a journey of deep, extreme feeling, from sorrow and betrayal to unexpected joy. It is a kind of pilgrimage. We mark that pilgrimage with a series of special services, one for each day of Holy Week, which are each a way-station on the journey. The week starts full of hope, as the followers of Jesus hail his entry into Jerusalem as a sign of liberation from the Roman occupation. They have not noticed that he comes riding on a donkey, a Prince of Peace, humble and gentle, not a rebel commander in a guerilla war. He knows he rides not to triumph but to death.

Three evening services on the Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday help to prepare us spiritually for the events of Thursday and Friday, when Jesus shows his friend how he proposes to give himself away for their sakes, in sharing bread and wine, and in washing their feet like a servant. That night he is arrested and tried, and his friends betray their trust and run away. The next day, Good Friday, he is killed by judicial process, and his followers see the wreck of all their hopes.

But early on the Sunday morning, as the women he knew come to the tomb to tend and honour his dead body, they find the tomb empty and a message from the angels who wait there: 'He is not here; he has risen and has gone ahead of you to Galilee!' That is our Easter celebration: that from God's willingness to die as a helpless human being comes life for all who trust in his infinite mercy and strength.

Walk some or all of this journey with us: from darkness to light, from despair to hope and joy.
