Thriplow Household Waste Recycling Centre is **open** for residents who have essential waste that cannot be stored safely at home. The times are the usual summer hours **8am - 5pm seven days a week**.

Now (since 22 June), **all visitors must book a time slot to enter** (Including existing e-permit holders).. Diversion route - There is currently a diversion route in place for accessing the site. If approaching the site from Duxford on the A. 505, you cannot turn right at the usual turning for the site (Gravel Pit Hill). Carry on for a mile and half for the exit to Fowlmere and follow the road into and through Fowlmere and through Thriplow. Returning from the site – turn left and you may then turn left again on to the A.505 TO Duxford.

The Parish Council is intending to remove the public bench on Frogge Street owing to its poor state of repair and would welcome suggestions for a more tranquil location for the replacement bench.

NHS Test and Trace scams:

Contact tracers will only call you from the number 0300 013 5000. Anyone who does not wish to talk over the phone can request the NHS Test and Trace service to send an email or text instead, inviting them to log into the web-based service. All text or emails sent by NHS Test and Trace will ask people to sign into the contact tracing website and will provide you with a unique reference number. We would advise people to type the web address <https://contact-tracing.phe.gov.uk> directly into their browser, followed by the unique reference number given to you, rather than clicking on any link provided in the message.

The NHS Test and Trace service will never:

- ask you to dial a premium rate number to speak to them (for example, those starting 09 or 087)
- ask you to make any form of payment or purchase a product of any kind
- ask for any details about your bank account
- ask for your social media identities or login details, or those of your contacts
- ask you for any passwords or PINs, or ask you to set up any passwords or PINs over the phone
- ask you to download any software to your PC or ask you to hand over control of your PC, smartphone or tablet to anyone else
- ask you to access any website that does not belong to the government or NHS

We've been gradually getting up to date and quite a few photos have now been added to the archive. Just click on thumbnails to see larger versions:

- 'Archaeology and Artefacts' contains a new album 'Fieldwalking' showing the finds that the **Fieldwalking** group came across at Abbey Farm until COVID-19 called a temporary halt to activities.
- 'Events Through the Decades, 2020s' sadly only contains 2 albums so far for 2020 – the '**New Year's Day Walk**' and '**COVID-19, Life in Lockdown** including the **VE Day 75th Anniversary**' The COVID-19 album aims to record something of how strange life has been these last months. We'd love it if you could send us more photos to add to the album, maybe of village scenes, you and your family's life in lockdown, activities you've done or things you've spent time making. Please do send them to me or Clare Driver (clare@domesticblissappointments.co.uk) preferably high resolution. It would also be great to have letters, poems or paintings from children about their lives in lockdown. Please say if you do **not** want your name included in the online archive. We have been unable to change the **Phone Box Display** in the old telephone box during this time but, when we can safely do so, some of these photos, letters and so on will be displayed. They might be particularly interesting for those who have not been able to stray far from home and do not have the technology to view the archive Gallery.
- 'Ickleton Folk' – we're grateful to Martin Hanchett for sending us some photos of members of the **Hanchett family** together with a book and some documents recording family history research of the Ickleton members of the family which will go into the archive in due course. The Hanchetts were important farmers, malsters and millers, owners and tenants of land and property in Ickleton. At various times they owned or had interests in Norman Hall and Little Farm, Brookhampton Hall, Ivy Farm (the farmhouse is now Harlequin House), Turtles Farm (the

farmhouse is now part of Hovells) and land now part of Valance Farm. They also built the mill by the river. The photos are at B546 to B560.

- 'Farming Life' – 2 photos, C087 and C088 have been added which seem to be of a rally or show of old farm machines taken around 1996. One appears to be a demonstration of steam threshing and the other is a traction engine called Old Nick. If you enlarge that photo you will find some information about its ownership and how it has been used over the years. Any further information about these would be gratefully received.

Some of our **Arrows Scouts** (Tues, 10½-14 yrs) did a Run for Heroes 5km challenge either walking or running locally.




