# **Greater Cambridge Partnership – making connections update**

The Executive Board have requested that officers develop a revised package of measures reflecting the public's feedback to the Making Connections consultation and following discussions with the Joint Assembly. In the autumn a detailed proposal will be brought back to the GCP's Joint Assembly for scrutiny before the Executive Board decides whether and how to proceed with any scheme.

The updated proposal could include changes to the operating hours of a Sustainable Travel Zone and a more extensive package of exemptions.

# For your diaries...Coploe Pit work - help - 21st October 2023

You are invited to join the Wardens of the Parish pit on Saturday 21st October between 10am and 12pm to help maintain the biodiversity of the chalk grassland. The pit contains a wide variety of native plants such as Autumn Gentian and it is necessary to control invasive species such as bramble, clematis and blackthorn that would otherwise swamp the more delicate flora. We will therefore be strimming and raking up cuttings and cutting/digging out scrub. This biodiverse chalk grassland has seen an enormous national decline in recent decades due to changes in agricultural practices. The Wildlife Trust recognises the importance of our local pit and provided guidance on its management as a nature reserve.

If you can spare an hour or two meet by the pit gate at the top of Coploe Hill from 10am. As parking is limited we suggest you walk up from the village, although there is a hard stand parking area beyond the pit further down the hill. We shall have a break at 11 so bring a drink and snack if required. Tools and gloves will be provided but you are welcome to use your own, including secateurs, loppers and spades. Also appropriate work clothing and stout footwear.

This initiative is made possible with the support of the Parish Council. We look forward to seeing you.

# From the Vicar - Testing times

August is a strange month for many teenagers (and their parents and grandparents). While most of us are in relax mode - school's been out for some time, people are away on holiday – many others are also counting down the days until exam results come out.

You may remember what that felt like. When you're 16 or 18, the weeks between finishing exams and results day can feel like a lifetime. It's almost long enough to forget that the exams ever happened. And then the day comes...



This year's results will be watched closely. Grade boundaries are gradually being returned to normal, after the more generous approach during COVID times. However, to compensate for the years of disrupted learning, exam timetables have been more spaced out and the scope of some exams was altered. In maths and science, students were given formulae and equation sheets, and in languages subjects students would not have been tested on unfamiliar vocabulary.

While this help is realistic and was doubtless welcome, we should remember that these pupils have experienced several challenging years: school life has not simply returned to normal. Press reports have highlighted increasing levels of absence

from school, especially amongst disadvantaged pupils, thought to be caused more by such issues as poverty, illness and anxiety, rather than just a case of widespread skiving. Meanwhile, schools have been under substantial budget pressure and are finding recruitment and retention of teachers difficult.

So, spare a thought for those young people, families and schools who will be nervously awaiting the 17th and 24th August (A level and GCSE results days, respectively), and if you pray, remember them in your prayers.

God, you have given us every good and perfect gift, and you are generous without finding fault. Be with young people as they wait for and receive their exam results. May they know the wisdom that comes from heaven, through Jesus Christ your Son. Amen.

#### Conservation of Gertrude Bowen's Photo Album

An important part of the Society's work is maintaining and preserving the village Archives for future generations. We have a huge collection of historic, and more recent, documents and memorabilia relating to the village and its surroundings. Sometimes these items come to us in poor condition needing conservation which is an expensive undertaking. Membership subscriptions and donations to the Society go towards cost of such work.

A recent example is the repair and conservation of an important photograph album from 1894 belonging to Ickleton resident Gertrude Bowen - nee Chamberlain – (1876-1967), niece of Joseph Chamberlain and cousin of British PM Neville Chamberlain. Conservation of this album was made possible through generous donations from two members of the Society along with funds from annual subs.

The album provides a fascinating record of Gertrude's grand tour through Europe as a young woman of 18 as well as her early married life in the village. Gertrude and her husband George were generous benefactors to Ickleton including building and endowing three bungalows in Frogge Street for elderly parishioners, known as the Gertrude Homes. The properties are today a registered charity providing homes to those in need and with a strong connection to the village.

# Members' visit to All Saints Church and Jesus College Chapel, Cambridge, Thursday 7 September, 10.30 am - 12.15 pm

We are very fortunate in Cambridge to have some exceptional examples of Gothic Revival architecture and interiors. The Ickleton Society is organising a visit to two of the finest examples of this work. Our private guided tour will take us inside All Saints Church, otherwise known as "the painted church" for its exceptional wall and ceiling painted decoration, and then across the road to Jesus College Chapel with stained glass and the breathtaking nave ceiling by the firm of Morris & Co.

Rarely open to the public, All Saints is the work of architect George Frederick Bodley with interiors by William Morris, Charles Emer Kempe, and the Cambridge firm of Frederick Leach (employer of art decorator David Parr). We will learn about the history and decoration of the church from two experienced guides. At Jesus College Chapel we will focus on the works undertaken by William Morris and his firm.

Places on the tour are limited so early booking is recommended. Places are £10 each for members. #### **WETLANDS WALKS**

#### **Glow-worm walks**

Despite the rain, the second glow-worm walk was also a success, with sightings of soprano pipistrelle bats from the bridge, and multiple sightings of glow-worms along the path through the wetlands, between the wooden bridge and the railway crossing. There have also been some sightings recently in Mill Lane towards the railway crossing.

#### Summer season walks

The walk on Wednesday the 19<sup>th</sup> of July was the last of the weekly walks, from now on they return to monthly. Despite the forecast for rain it stayed dry, and there were even sunny intervals. Those that wanted to look, were rewarded by sightings of young grass snakes and common lizards. Everyone got to see large numbers of butterflies, particularly meadow browns, skippers, brown argus and red admirals. A total of twelve different species. We also saw six-spot burnet moths, hawker and darter dragonflies, and banded-demoiselle damselflies. The pyramidal orchids were starting to go over, but there were still a good crop. Add to that the constant backdrop of birdsong, and it made for a very pleasant hour's walk.

#### **Granta Medical Practices Flu Clinics 2023**

Flu vaccination is important because, whilst flu is unpleasant for most people, it can be dangerous and even life-threatening to others, particularly those with certain health conditions. The best times to have your flu vaccine is early autumn before flu starts spreading. However, you can get your vaccine later if necessary.

Most flu vaccines are given with a needle in the arm but there is also a nasal spray flu vaccine.

The dates at Sawston Health Centre are as follows:

Saturday 23rd September and Saturday 7th October. 8.30 am - 4.15 pm

Other dates (Saturdays) are available at Granta practices at Shelford, Linton, Royston and Barley.

Primary school children will be vaccinated in school and only eligible to have through us if they have an underlying health condition mentioned above.

Please note that the over 50's with no underlying conditions are no longer eligible for a free NHS flu vaccine. However, private flu vaccinations will be widely available through high street pharmacies, etc.

Eligible patients will shortly receive a text with a link to book a flu jab, or you can call us on 0300 234 5555. Clinics will be available to book into from August.
